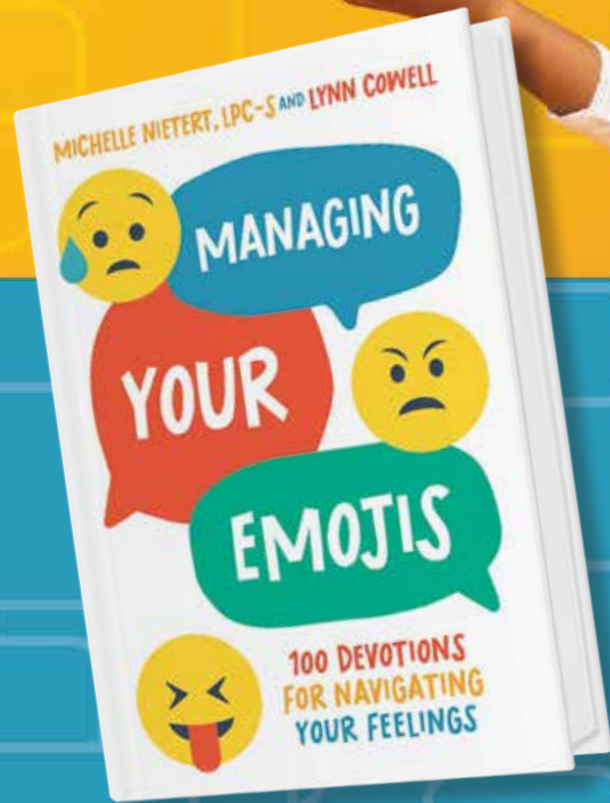

"Fear not, for I have redeemed you;

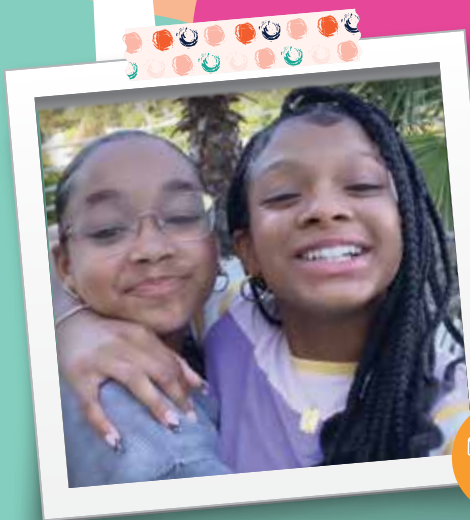

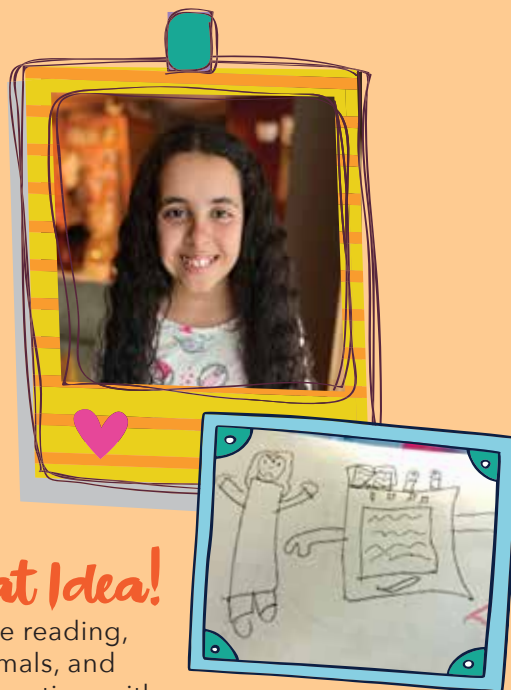
Creation Sings

I AM YOURS

The earth is the Lord's, and everything in it, the world, and all who live in it.

PSALM 24:1

Have you ever felt like something was a perfect fit for you? A moment when you realized you were in just the right place and part of something special. I'm not talking about really deep things, but simple things. Like when you played your first sport—soccer or softball—and you helped your team win. Or the time you acted in your first play or performed your first dance. You had that special sense of belonging. You fit in, and you had your own important part to play.

Nothing is wrong with wanting to be a part of something. All of us girls want to belong. Feeling this way is very human, and it's something we all desperately seek. The good news is, we will always fit in as far as God is concerned. If you believe in Jesus and have accepted His love and forgiveness, then you belong to Him and are an important member of His family.

You belong to God. Repeat these words out loud: **I am Yours.**

Do it again, but this time say them like you are talking to God: I am Yours.

Do it one more time, but this time, believe what you are saying. Speak it to God and be determined in your mind that you will believe these words for the rest of your life! **I AM YOURS!**

I ask you to do this because believing this statement will have a really big impact on how you live your life and how you think about belonging. You will belong to a lot of groups in your life, and that's great. But realizing that you belong to God first will help you keep your sense of belonging in everything else in the proper perspective. That just means that putting

God first will help you understand how, when, and why you do everything else!

When you realize you belong to God, talking to Him becomes really important. He wants to get to know you really personally, and through prayer, we practice getting to know Him really personally! Don't worry about how you pray—just talk to God, and He will always hear you. Remember, you are His, and you belong!

TELL ME ABOUT YOURSELF!

"Always be prepared to give an answer to everyone who asks you to give the reason for the hope that you have. But do this with gentleness and respect."

1 PETER 3:15

One of the things I wasn't so excited about when returning to school after summer was the usual question everyone asked: **"Tell me about yourself!"** I never liked talking about myself, so it made me a bit nervous, but I learned that when someone asks about you, it's important to have an answer that is clear and honest.

You can very easily talk about your faith, family, pets, your role on a sports team, the art you like to make or even your part-time job. **Think of the things that really let people know who you are and what makes sense for who you are meeting.**

I work in a field called public relations and what I help my clients do is come up with their story. Sometimes it is about their company or maybe it's about a project they have or a product they're selling, but it all boils down to a smart but brief introduction that is appropriate for the people you're getting to know. This is sometimes called an "elevator pitch." (See page 20 for more!)

I always think of the specific person or group of people I will be meeting and come up with things that will be helpful for them to know about me. Meeting a new client for work would have different highlights than

meeting a new friend. Here's my "not-work meeting" introduction:

Hi, I'm Jackie! I moved to Nashville 20 years ago from New Mexico for my dream job as a writer and public relations professional. I now own my own business in this field. I have three small rescue pups, I love to hike and also mentor young women who want to be writers and entrepreneurs. I love to read the Bible and my favorite verse is Matthew 6:33, *"Seek ye first the kingdom of God, and His righteousness; and all these things shall be added unto you."*

I like including my favorite scripture because Jesus is the center of my life and that's important to me. I put it at the end

because when it's the last thing I say, it is usually the first thing they ask about, which usually leads me into a beautiful conversation about Jesus, my favorite topic. I find my identity in Him first before anything else, as I am sure you do!

Spend some time thinking about who you are in Christ, who you are as a student, an athlete, a musician, artist or family member, and what you feel confident sharing. Once you have that list down, practice with a family member or friend. Remember it's not all about words either. **A friendly tone of voice, an extended hand, and a joyful smile will come together for the best introduction ever!**

MAGNIFICENT OR MUNDANE?

O LORD, you have examined my heart and know everything about me. You know when I sit down or stand up. You know my thoughts even when I'm far away. You see me when I travel and when I rest at home. You know everything I do. You know what I am going to say even before I say it, LORD.

So, here's the deal. **Even JESUS didn't have a life filled-to-the-brim with magnificent moments.** There were angels at His birth, but then we don't read much about Him until he's 12. Then, we don't read anything else until He is 30! That's 18 years! (You probably haven't even lived that long yet!) After that, He had a lot of magnificent moments before He died.

But much of even Jesus's life was pretty mundane. (That is to say normal and not extraordinary.) We all have a lot of mundane moments in our lives! For example, I love writing books and speaking at True Girl live events. But a lot of my time is spent in boring meetings, organizing timelines for projects, and doing other mundane tasks.

At home, my mundane moments include washing the dishes after dinner and ordering all the different foods for our farm animals. No one would see these parts of my life and think: **Wow! That's magnificent!**

But God sees those moments. And that makes them important. So I try to live them well.

Do you? My purpose in God is not defined by whether I do magnificent or mundane things. We believe having a calling to do something great "for God" and being called to serve a great God are not the same thing. The subtle difference between these two is important.

Having a calling to do something great for God puts the focus on you and presses upon us the burden of perfectionism.

Having a calling to serve a great God keeps the focus on Him and frees you to simply faithfully obey God day by day and moment by moment.

Be faithful in the magnificent moments everyone sees. And the mundane moments only God sees.

Let's Talk About Identity...

A CHAT WITH DANNAH AND DANI

God delights in us! What gifts or attributes do you believe God gave you to show that delight?

Dannah: Well, God had given me and my family many gifts but me personally, I can sing, I can act, I can dance, I can cook, and I can do interviews just like this one!

What advice would you give other girls like you about knowing your worth in Christ? Does being on social media and TV make it hard to remember your worth in Christ?

Dannah: My advice to young girls my age about knowing your worth in Christ is that you are made in His image. And you are beautiful and wonderfully made in every shape size and form possible. So, to better understand yourself you have to first understand that God knew you first. God loves you and everything you come with. To be honest, being on TV helps me understand who I am and who I want to be because it taught me about what I want to do for the rest of my life.

Dani: My advice is to not forget to insert God in your daily routine. Being in the media is hard because it forces you to care about how everybody perceives you and it's easy to get lost in that.

You are unique and uniquely gifted. But is there something you wish you could change about yourself? Or something you wish you could learn to be or do?

Dannah: I don't think so. I love myself and I encourage other people my age to love themselves as I do. Of course, realistically, there are things I don't particularly like, but that's completely normal. I still don't wish I could change them. Because they make me who I am.

What gives you confidence?

Dannah: My own self. I understand that I'm not perfect, but I'm made from God, so that's something! If I have God in me, why wouldn't I be confident in myself?

Dani: It gives me confidence knowing I get to wake up and be me every day!

★ **Our identity starts from within, yet most people meet us from the outside first! How do you let your identity in Christ shine around others?**

Dannah: I let my identity in Christ shine by always spreading the Word everywhere I go. If someone asks me a question, I always have Scripture to back it up. Everywhere I walk I make sure everybody knows I'm a child of God and I'm proud to be one.

Dani: Everything I do is to bring glory to God in hopes that when people see me, they see Him first.

What are some ways you listen to what God says about you in His Word and tells you in your life?

Dannah: I try and read my Bible every night. Despite everything that may or may not be going on in my life I always have time for my Creator.

Dani: Philippians 4:13 reminds me that I can do all things through Christ who strengthens me.



If you're ever feeling down about yourself, what do you do to cheer yourself up? How do you help a sister or a friend who is going through a low time?

Dannah: Proverbs 3:5-6 is one of the lift-up scriptures I would tell someone in need of cheerful advice. *"Trust in the LORD with all your heart, and do not lean on your own understanding. In all your ways acknowledge Him, and He will make straight your paths."*

Dani: Sometimes criticism can be challenging to take, but as long as it's coming from a good place with good intentions, I think about how I can use it as self-improvement. Running track is an outlet for me and when someone else is feeling down I try to bring that positivity back by doing things that uplift them.

In your work on TV and social media, you have to present yourself to thousands of people. How is who you are "on screen" the same as how you are in your every day? How is it different?

Dannah: Well, I've played a small number of different characters online, and they're all different and so am I. I can't necessarily compare them all to myself because even though I've played them, we are different! But I can say that the person I am on screen is the person I am in real life. The best part about it is that I'm still growing as a person so when I change, every project I do changes with me.

Dani: Some people don't know this, but I am somewhat of an introvert and get really nervous before appearances and interviews!

What are some favorite projects that you have worked on, and favorite people you have worked with?

Dannah: My favorite project I've worked on is *Kenan*. And some of my favorite people I've worked with were Leah Michelle and Charles Michael Davis on *Same Time Next Christmas* and Kenan Thompson and Chris Redd.

Dani: One of my favorite projects to work on was the Build-A-Bear promotion. I had so much fun, and they gave me my own bear to keep!

Tell us about someone you were excited to meet and what you learned from them after you did!

Dannah: I was so excited to meet Halle Berry and when I did, she told me that she was passing the torch to me and my sister and that we were the next generation of actors! She is also one of my biggest inspirations when it comes to acting. It was so amazing to see her play Ariel in *The Little Mermaid* and it inspires me and reminds me that greatness doesn't have an age or color.

Dani: One of the best people I've worked with by far is Kenan Thompson. He is a great person and somebody I look up to very much.

What do you like best about working in entertainment? What is the most difficult part of working in entertainment?

Dannah: The best part is being able to set an amazing example and being a role model and an influence for young black girls my age who have a dream like I do. The most difficult part for me is probably being able to act as different characters, but not to become them.

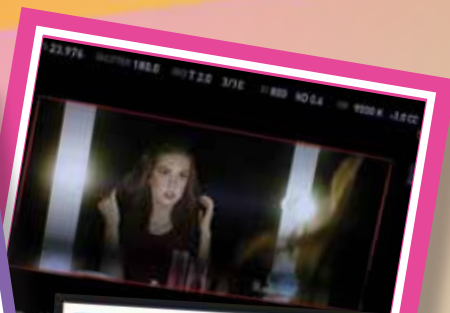

DEAR

I feel pressure to be someone I am not just to fit in and have friends. Actually, I am still figuring out who I am. How can I make sure I'm being myself and not giving into the pressures to change who I am?"

LOVE, SARAH, 11

MEANT TO BE

I LOVE this question because you are recognizing that being who God made you to be is more important than fitting in with those around you.

Though this is not easy, it's one of the greatest ways we can learn to love God with all our hearts, minds, souls, and bodies (Luke 10:27.) The number one way we are challenged in our walks with God is to question who we are and to doubt the incredible creation God has made each of us. Psalm 139:14 says: "You created my inmost being; you knit me together in my mother's womb ... All the days ordained (a fancy word for chosen) for me were written in your book before even one of them came to be."

The Bible tells us that God knit you together and chose your hair, the color of your eyes, the color of your skin, the sound of your laugh, your personality and the things you enjoy doing. Like a grandma who is knitting a blanket, every part of who you are went through the hand of God and was chosen. And He says it's good. He calls you a masterpiece! (Ephesians 2:10) Now, who can argue with the God of the Universe? Right?

So often, people want to tell us who we should be and what we need to do to fit in. In God's family, we get to be who He made us to be, and rest in the truth that we are wonderful in His eyes. When and if people say mean words, tease you, or just ignore parts of who you are made to be, remember this. God sees you. God knows you. And God thinks you are incredible.

This is why it's important to have God's voice be the loudest one in our heads and hearts by reading His word and staying close to His people. At times, it can get very confusing as we figure out our stories, personalities, and who God made us to be, but God already knows. So, lean into His voice and remember that the most important opinion about your identity and defining who you are is GOD's voice.

BUILD A TEAM!

I have one person for each finger on my right hand—five—that I call my encouragement team. Each person is someone I trust to remind me who I am when I forget. For you, it might be a mom, a dad, an aunt, a close friend, or a pastor. When I am forgetting who I am or listening to the voices of those who are hurtful, I go to this encouragement team and am quickly reminded that God knew what He was doing when He made me. You can do the same. Try writing down five things that describe you. Whether it's something in your story (like traveling to another country) or it's a passion you have (like reading science-fiction books), take time to notice who God made you to be. If you need some help, ask someone on your encouragement team.

A Courageous Girl knows her design is on purpose and her identity lies within what God says about her. You are deeply loved, young friend, and God is up to everything good in and through your life!

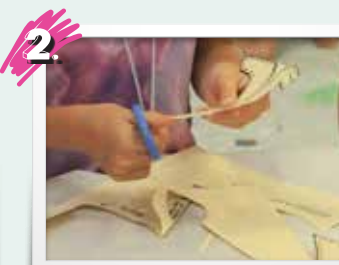

SUPPLIES

10x20 canvas (or cardboard), Templates (see below), Assorted Fabrics, Pencil, Scissors, Elmer's Glue and Glue Sticks, Paint: Blue, Green and Skin Tones, Foam Brush (1 inch), Small Detail Paint Brush, White Chalk, Optional: Ribbon, Beads, Glitter, Buttons, Colorful Paper (for butterflies and flowers to embellish), Copier and Card Stock Paper (Card stock is best!)



1 PAINT the sky blue and grass green. Leave the bottom 1/4 of your canvas for a grass "hill." Let dry.



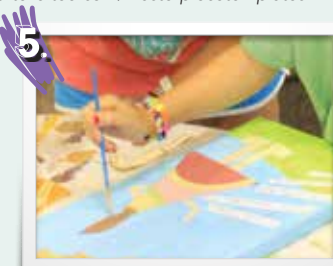
2 PRINT out the four templates (umbrella, girl, hair, hat and Scripture) from thouartexalted.com/masterpiecetemplates.



3 CUT out the templates and with a pencil TRACE the templates onto your canvas. Place the umbrella in the upper left hand corner. Girl wraps her hand on the handle of the umbrella. NOTE: Make sure you select the right hairstyle for YOU!



4 Using white chalk, TRACE the template onto fabric for the umbrella, dress, boots, optional hat, and CUT. TIP: Make sure the right side of the fabric matches your template.

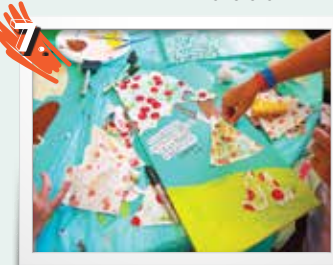


5 your time, paint thin lines, and stay in the lines you have drawn.

IDENTIFYING ME!

You are uniquely created by God. And your fingerprints are just one of the many ways you can know that you are the only you He created! Your fingerprints are completely unique to you! Even identical twins have different patterns on their fingers.

Fingerprints are a physical manifestation of the amazing growth you did as you were formed in the womb. Human skin has several layers. As you develop, those layers stretch and pull. Sometimes they get stuck on one another or grow at different rates. When this happens, your skin can get pushed and pulled and snagged on itself and the fingerprints begin to form. Scientists also think that our fingerprints are a very unique feature that helps us to survive and thrive on our blue planet, which is covered in water. Have you noticed that when you are in water a long time that the wrinkles get even bigger? This allows you to have a strong grip on things, even when wet.

Humans aren't the only creature with fingerprints! Gorillas, koalas and even cats have unique finger (or toe-bean) prints! Your fingerprint stays the same as you grow, but things such as rough work (like masonry), deep cuts or injuries and even some medicine can cause them to change or smooth out over time.



Many people use their fingerprints to lock up their phone securely, but did you know that other parts of your body are unique as well? Your tongue print and toe print are also unique to you, but it wouldn't be much fun to have to lick your phone or take off your shoe to unlock your phone! Fingerprints can even be used to identify criminals! Your body naturally produces oil and that means that you leave fingerprints on almost everything you touch. When a crime is committed, forensic experts can use a super-

fine powder to dust for fingerprints and possibly identify someone who has committed a crime!

We don't have the super-fine powder that detectives use, but you can see your fingerprints at home using a pencil, paper and a bit of clear tape.

TRY IT!

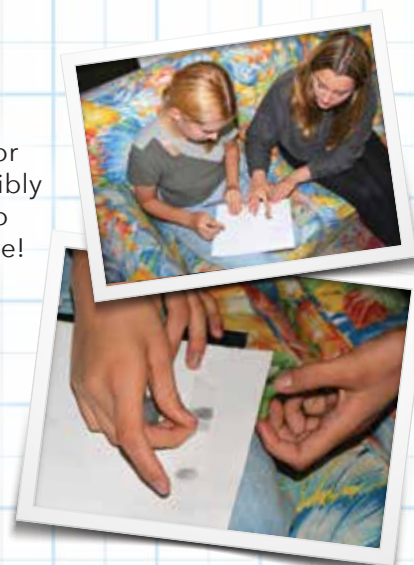
Using a pencil, color in a square on a sheet of paper. Press down to make it as dark as possible. Rub your finger on the square. You should be able to see that the graphite is now on your finger. Next, take a bit of clear tape and press it on your fingertip, then carefully peel it off and stick it down on a sheet of white paper. You should be able to clearly see your fingerprint!

Fingerprints come in three main types of patterns called the loop, whorl and arch. Each finger might have a different pattern. What do you have? Is it the same as your siblings or parents? Fingerprint patterns are influenced both by genetics and environment, so you might have fingerprints that look nothing like the rest of your family!

FINGERPRINT PATTERNS



Isn't it amazing that our God cares so much about us that He even makes us unique down to the very folds of our skin? He formed us in the womb and tells us in Jeremiah 1:5: "Before I formed you in the womb I knew you, before you were born I set you apart." He knew that we were special when He created us!

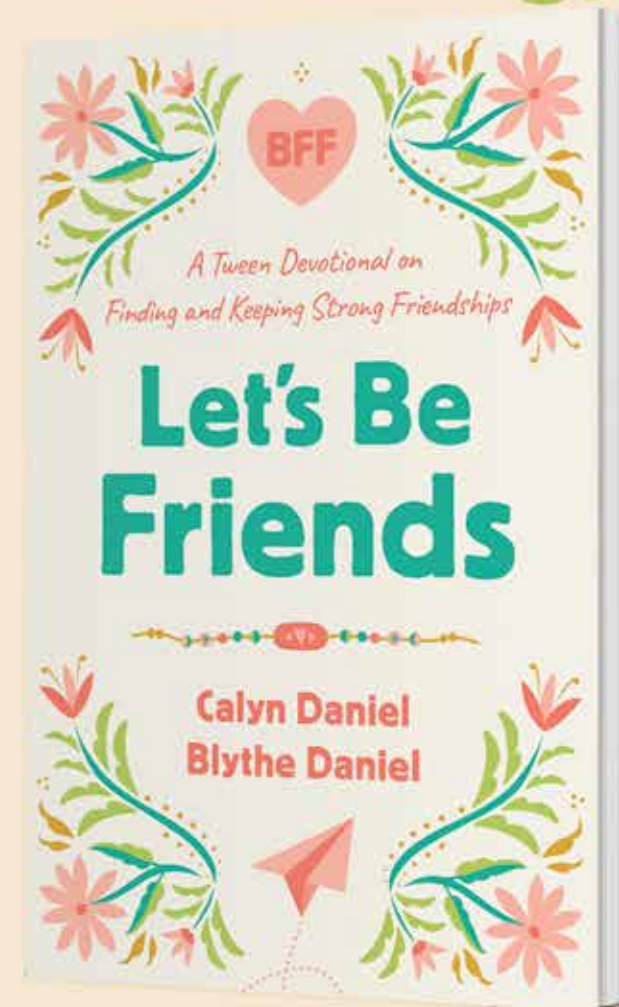

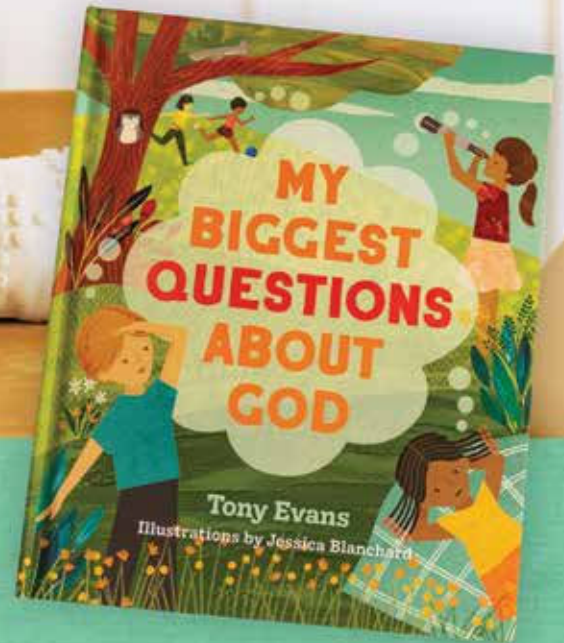
